## Announcement Letter January 1982

A new Gregorian year is upon us. If the general world troubles should grow proportionately to those of 1981, it should prove to be a most troubling year. There is a greatly divided opinion relative to what will happen economically. No small group of economists believe the economic picture will improve after the first quarter of the year. On the other hand, there is a significant coterie of economists who believe we are yet to experience a deeper monetary plunge. As one analyst put it, the chances for an accurate prediction are almost nil. In both 1979 and 1980, the predictions were nearly reversed. It is a time of alarm and concern.
