Announcement Letter April 1982

The time of Passover and the Days of Unleavened Bread are once again upon us. May all of us here in Eugene convey our deep love, respect and warm regards to all of you who are far removed from us. We think of you daily. You are always in our prayers. The long separation does have one unique advantage. It allows for the development and growth of a very meaningful anticipation — the anticipation of seeing each other at the Feast of Tabernacles. This phenomenon occurs yearly — from feast to feast.

Our lives are very much intertwined with one another. Being brothers and sisters in Christ allows for the development of very strong and emotionally binding ties. The more we lose our selfish individualism, the more we become intricately bound up in the spiritual ties of the one family to which we all belong. It is the only really lasting relationship.

May I take this opportunity to thank you all for the out-flowing of concern for us. It is the result of the introductory information which I put in the Announcement Letter last month. FEAST OF TABERNACLES:

We are encouraging and recommending that all who can should lodge in the Gateway area this year. These are the motels closest to the meeting location. The rooms are exceptionally clean. The Rodeway Inn: 3350 Gateway; Springfield, Oregon 97477. Phone: (503) 747-0332. They offer both kitchenettes and weekly rates. With limited maid service, the weekly charge is \$175.00 plus tax. The charge is for one or two people. Each additional person costs \$2.00 plus tax. The extra night will cost the regular daily rate.

NOTE: Rodeway bought out the International Dunes. There is no way to compare rates with those given to us last year.

Other motels in that general area are: Ramada Inn — on Gateway near the Pacific 6 Motor Inn, and the Country Squire — which are located at the Coburg exit, just a few miles from the Gateway area.
