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Announcement Letter May 1982

Passover has come and gone. Again, what a meaningful occasion God allowed us to experience. Is there any yearly function, event, or activity which so thoroughly inspires, motivates, and gives a sense of confidence and purpose? How great to yearly accept the benevolent sacrifice of our Savior, Jesus Christ!
