Warm And Kind Greetings To All:

It is hard to believe that a month has passed since the Feast of Tabernacles concluded. Winter is fast approaching. Then, before we realize it, Spring will be upon us again. We surely wonder why time seemed to drag so slowly when we were young. With respect to time, it is amazing how greatly our minds are subject to varying emotional stimuli so that we often become unaware of its passing.

CURRENT EVENTS

It is a volatile world. Almost instantly nations become involved in some "limited" war. Human life is regarded so cheaply anymore. And yet few, if any, really know the "reasons" why we are involved in these skirmishes.

Today we are engaged in at least two confrontations which could lead to wider and ever-wider military activity — the Lebanon crisis and now Grenada, almost on our door step. If we were truly fighting for territorial rights, the preservation of national sovereignty or national (public) interests abroad, the whole situation would be far more comprehensible. But, as indicated above, the general public of America does not know for what reasons these skirmishes even exist. If we are not going to be equally deceived, we had better make sure we are not merely swayed by popularized propaganda. To know is to understand — to grasp the real reasons, not the "canned" information determined to allay all fears and restive quests of an aroused public.

How many killings, assassinations, kidnappings, and other atrocities have occurred in the past years and months by design? If our eyes are open, there are events which are beyond the category of coincidence. One certainly has to wonder.

From much of what I am reading at the present time, the economic recovery has sputtered to a virtual standstill. I am aware of many of the statistics which are presented, but there is too much of the real picture left out of these considerations. By carefully adjusting figures, statistics can be made to indicate just about anything one

desires. But, after all this manipulation, the true picture still exists. The real hard-core unemployment situation still prevails just about as it did previously. Here and there, there are glimmers of hope. But, in other areas, the situation does not seem improved at all. When one is out of work and unable to locate gainful employment whereby to care for a family, statistics of significant improvement are little reassuring. The facts are still quite real to him.

Earthquake news is heard from other places. In the past few days, the northern portion of Idaho was hit rather sharply. Mr. and Mrs. Bill Scherer, of Boise, are fine, although they felt the severity of the shock. Indeed, earthquakes in diverse places. Where next?
