COMMENTS

All people do not have faith. As it was in the first century, some have seen their faith shattered (I Tim. 1:19). Obedience to doctrine is the manifestation of true and genuine faith. It is obvious that as a result of disappointment, the initial beliefs (given by God at the time of call) are rejected and set aside (I Tim. 5:12).

Today is no different than the first century. Some cannot remain faithful. Assuming either ministerial or prophetic capability, these faithless will espouse a heretical doctrine foreign to anything originally taught by God's chosen and sent instruments of the last days.

Since we do not subscribe to the administrative faux pas of the parent body, we need to determine just what God expects of us when such situations arise.

In outline form we want to give you the instructions of God. They are as follows.

- A. Jesus promised that the Truth would be taught in these last days.

 Matt. 28:19-20. (Remember, the twelve apostles are not still
 living in the days of Christ's Second Coming.)
- B. How are (were) the people taught the Truth in the last days?

 Rom. 10:11-15. God is an unchanging Being. Remember the missions of Moses, Christ, and others?
- C. When the people were called, heard the message, and responded, they were added to one Body -- not many differing and contrary groups.

Matt. 16:18. The Church of Christ.

What? Col. 1:24. (How many bodies did Christ have?)
I Cor. 12:12-28. One Body -- many members -- the members are individuals, not groups.
Eph. 4:1-5.

D. In the last days, an apostasy ("falling away" in the Greek is apostasia) had to occur.

II Thess. 2:1-3. Since the word of God cannot be broken, we must find a group who once believed the whole of God's Word and then changed the initial doctrine -- as taught in the last days. It must be fulfilled in a single generation. Those who believed turned away (II Pet. 2:1-22, note vs. 21).

- E. What was the cause -- source -- of the apostasy? I Tim. 4:1-2.
- F. In the presence of such conditions, what are the faithful to do?
 II Thess. 2:15.
 II Tim. 3:13-14.
 Col. 1:23.
- G. When initially called, how do the people view the Truth? I Thess. 2:13. (Disappointment changes all of that. Bitterness begins to prevail.)
- H. Because of confusion and prevailing heresy, what is our daily urgent need? Jude 3-4.
 I Pet. 5:9.

- I. The fundamental Christian duty is what? Eph. 4:13.
- J. Therefore, if some will not obey the <u>original</u> doctrine, what does God require of you?
 Rom. 16:17.
 II Thess. 3:6, 14.
 Titus 3:10-11.
 II John 10-11.

Some men cannot maintain faith. They will assume many things. They have no fear of God. Publications, letters, etc., will be circulated. God said such conditions are necessary (I Cor. 11:19). Will you fear God enough to obey Him? Only you and I can answer that question -- each one for himself.

We do not want to mention names. The facts of God's Word ought to be sufficient. If we play with fire we might get burned. A blessing goes to those who can truly walk by faith, not by sight (II Cor. 5:7).

A word to the wise is sufficient.
