# Announcement Letter November 2005

### Dear Brethren:

We are all just returning home from another very successful Feast of Tabernacles, and what a blessing this fall Holy Day season has been for our brethren around the world. Reports from all of our Feast sites have been very positive, and it appears God certainly answered our collective prayers to protect and inspire us. It is a pleasure to write to you now and express our deepest thanks for all that so many of you did to serve and make those occasions so positive for others. There is nothing that can compare to the exhilaration that comes from brethren of real unity meeting together to fulfill God's command. The Spirit was truly evident in the behavior of those who attended, and it was impossible not to be touched deeply by that experience. We enjoyed something that can never happen by accident or by the will of any human being. It can only happen by the inspiration of God, working within the lives of His dear and responsive children.

Now that we are all back home again and forced to take up our normal routines in the world, we face the challenge that is common after the "high" of God's festival celebration is past. That challenge is to retain the positive benefits of our Feast experiences and prevent the world from robbing us of that vision and hope of the future. While we are insulated from the world during that eight-day Feast and immersed in spiritual stimuli, we come out of the fog and see things more clearly. We are better able to recognize the importance of those spiritual things of God in comparison to the pulls of that carnal world. The physical priorities back home seem less compelling as we focus on the hope of that grand tomorrow which awaits in God's master plan. We experience a renewal and a zeal for spiritual things, and we are apt to become motivated to really make a concerted effort in the coming year to grow closer to God.

But as soon as the Feast is over and we return home again, the world quickly rushes in with its demands, and we can feel overwhelmed. Before we know it, that sense of spiritual acuity and crystal clarity of priorities can become swamped by the demands of day-to-day

life. Brethren, this is a critical point in time, when we need to be asking God fervently to help us retain that enthusiasm and spiritual vision from the Feast. Satan will be very active now to attack each one of us, seeking to snatch away the positive benefits of that Feast experience. And while God gave us great protection from his wrath during the time of those holy convocations, Satan will be aggressive in seeking to undo all that you and I have gained.

Therefore, this is a time to be even more vigilant in fighting those feelings of despair and weakness. "Where there is no vision, the people perish: but he that keepeth the law, happy is he" (Proverbs 29:18). If we are urgent to fight those downward pulls, we can retain the benefits of our Feast experience, and then use that enthusiasm to truly make improvements in our lives during this coming year. Do not let yourselves be pulled right back into the same hurtful habits that may have robbed you of hope. Do not let that fog descend again to obscure the glorious future God is preparing for you. Fight to hold on to it, and let us all make this coming year one of the best yet for spiritual growth. Time is getting shorter. We know not how many more years God may afford us such peaceful assemblies to enjoy His Festivals. We need to be working aggressively to prepare for those tests of faith that are surely on the horizon.

Wherefore he saith, Awake thou that sleepest, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give thee light. See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise, Redeeming the time, because the days are evil (Ephesians 5:14–16).

May you all continue to fulfill the will of your Heavenly Father, who has called you to such a great and glorious future.
