Dear Brethren:

Given the volatile times in which we live, what a blessing still to enjoy real peace and tranquility in conducting this *small Work* to support and to serve a scattered remnant church. It is so very easy to take those blessings for granted, but we prod ourselves daily to thank God and to remember how much we depend upon Him moment by moment for our lives and for our every need. Part of our daily meditation is *a thanks* for each one of you, as the called of God, who have taken an interest in that Way of Life offered to us, giving us hope beyond the depressing and demoralizing atmosphere of this evil world. All of you know that there is a bright and glorious future before us, and what a pleasure we have in providing that *spiritual fuel* that you need—through sermons, letters, and articles—to pursue that Way with conviction and with diligence. It is a blessing to do this work to serve you. Thank you for the continuing opportunity to do so.

You will find in this *Letter* a summary of reports from each of our Feast of Tabernacles sites worldwide, confirming that we did indeed receive favor again in assembling to worship God in peace in all of those designated areas around the globe. A special thanks to all of you who participated in one of those festival gatherings, for doing your part to bring a positive, attentive, and harmonizing spirit into those assemblies.

For those of you who were unable to attend, but who share a sincere love for God's promises, we missed you, and we pray that you might have the blessing of assembly in future. If you are physically weak, or burdened by other pressures that have made your attendance feel impossible to accomplish, you are not alone. There are many, not few, who experience some level of those feelings and influences of mind and body. In some cases, without God's divine intervention to change your circumstance, it is indeed impossible for you to consider traveling to keep a Feast. In other cases, some of you are just as capable of traveling as many others who actually attended the Feast this year. If you get to know enough about many of our members, you will find inspiring personal stories of ones who had many reasons to claim they could not travel, and yet pulled out all stops in order to convoke nonetheless. Some truly cannot do it. Others, however, might find that a change in focused intensity might make all the difference.

We are all incredibly vulnerable. Vulnerable—because we are each only one lost breath away from death. At best, these human bodies are incredibly fragile. We live in a dangerous world, both from the potential of accidental forces that can maim and kill, as well

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as the treachery of those who seek to prey upon others without regard for the well-being of fellow man. Dangers to life and limb have been a reality since our earliest ancestors were thrust out of the Garden of Eden. Without God's divine protection, human beings are ever at risk for harm. And until the reformation of this earth under the benevolent rule of Jesus Christ, it will continue to be a world filled with perils. As we draw ever nearer that promised return of Christ, the dangers will continue to escalate, not abate.

But for all of that, the intent is not to cause you to respond with paranoia and fear. Regardless of the inherent dangers of living day by day, as the called of God, we are indeed promised special help and defense against every threat. God does not want His children living in fear of dangers, known and unknown.

Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me (Psalm 23:4).

If you are truly putting God first in your life, and setting your heart upon His glorious Kingdom, then He has promised to see you through every trial. You need not live in dread! But that comfort will not come because you are finding ways to "protect yourself." He did not say that *our own rod and staff* is our surety. Building yourself a bunker and stocking it with food and ammunition will not make you "safe." No, it is *His rod* and *His staff* that provide our true defense and aid.

That does not mean that He has promised to spare you from *experiencing the sensation of fear*. It is likewise a part of this glorious God's plan to force us to face our fears and to defeat them.

Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies . . . (vs. 5).

Yes, God will let you face threatening situations. Sometimes, He will even orchestrate it to *put you* in a dangerous environment. Why would a loving God do that? To force you to assess how much real faith you have acquired (or not). When He prepares a table for you in the midst of people and circumstances that threaten to destroy you, will you be able to respond with quiet confidence and trust Him? If we can do it correctly, in the midst of such trial, the power of God's Spirit will help us declare truthfully:

... thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the LORD for ever (Psalm 23:5–6).
